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Simple Past Regular Verbs

Simple past of regular verbs. The simple past is used to describe an action that occurred and was completed in the past. The simple past is formed by adding -ed to the base form of the verb (the infinitive without to). In English, the simple past of regular verbs is extremely easy.

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The construction of regular past-tense verbs, at least, is pretty straightforward. It is generally done by adding -d or -ed to the

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verb, and it doesn't change form based on the subject of the verb: I asked, he agreed, you accepted—the verbs in these instances all look alike, ending in "-ed."

Regular Verb Definition Unlike irregular verbs, those verbs that

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form their past participle with 'd' or 'ed' are regular verbs. These verbs do not undergo substantial changes while changing forms between tenses. If the verb ends with a vowel, only 'd' is added.

The present tense of a verb is the same as the verb's base form. To change a regular verb from present tense to past tense, you simply add "d" or "ed" to the end of the word. The past participle form of a regular verb is the same as the simple past form. Both end in "ed."

Regular Verbs: Definition and Examples

Regular Verb A regular verb is one that conforms to the usual rule for forming its simple past tense and its past participle. In English, the "usual" rule is to add "-ed" or "-d" to the base form of the verb to create the past forms.
